Opening and confirmation of the agenda by Jean-Jacques Biteau

Jean-Jacques Biteau opened the meeting at 12:10 hrs CEST.

Presidents report and strategy presentation

Peter Lloyd has resigned from his position as Vice-President Elect for personal reasons. Jean-Jacques thanks him for his service to the Association.

The departure of Peter Lloyd leaves a gap in between the presidency of Michael Poppelreiter (2019-2020) and Dirk Orlowsky (2021-2022). As per the EAGE Constitution XI.8: "In the event of a mid-term vacancy, other than the President's, the Board with the approval of the members may appoint a successor to serve on the Board for the remainder of the current term".

A slide with considerations of the Board is being shown:

- EAGE requires experienced leadership
- EAGE will soon embark on its next 5 year strategy, requiring a candidate who could offer continuity and build on what has been set in place over the course Vision 2020

- The Board needed to select a suitable candidate who could fulfil the duties of President at short notice and with minimal disruption to the operating of the Board.

The Board unanimously proposes Everhard Muijzert to serve as EAGE President 2020-2021. Caroline Lowrey speaks on behalf of the Board and says Everhards history and present experience has made him the ideal candidate.

Financial Overview

Operational results were according to budget:

- Neutral operational result for EAGE Holding
- Results negatively impacted by investment results, exchange rates & taxes

Funds

In 2016 the Board decided to spend 5 million in 5 years In 2017 and 2018, 1.711k was spent (937 in 2018) For 2019-2021, 3.289k is available

Investment portfolios shows a dip in share prices end of 2018.

Profit & Loss account 2018 shows a negative result of -621.000,- before fund spending. This is a considerable improvement compared to 2017 (-1.532).

Balance sheet as of December 31st shows a decrease, total 11.464 compared to 13.059 for 2017. There are enough reserves going forward and the board plans to have the association cash neutral by 2021.

A question is being asked by John Underhill (past President) regarding the high negative result (-1532) in 2017. Remco Bax (Finance Director) elaborates and gives the main reasons :

- 1. Paris event impacted the results severly
- 2. Attendancy level was low on a lot of events
- 3. Cancelled events throughout the fiscal year

Everhard requests for the approval of the annual accounts and discharge of the board for the management of the association in 2018: all approve.

Jean-Jacques finally asks for the approval of the minutes of 2017 and 2018: 1 abstention, all others approve.
